The Spearfish City Council met in Regular Session in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Services Centre at 7:00 PM on Monday, January 3, 2011 with the following members present: Aaker, Baker, Geppert, Morgan, Schmit and Young. Also present: City Administrator Neeb, Police Chief Rotert, Fire Chief White, Public Works Administrator Johnson, Finance Accountant Wenzel, Police Lieutenant Dean, City Planner Watson and City Attorney Pluimer. Mayor Krambeck presided and called the meeting to order. All stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Order of Business – Young moved, Morgan seconded and all voted to approve the Order of Business.

Consent Agenda – Morgan moved, Schmit seconded and all voted to approve the Consent Agenda.

A. Approve Minutes of Regular Session of December 20, 2010.

Public Hearing – Mayor Krambeck opened a Public Hearing at 7:02 PM to consider a Special Event liquor license for Leland Ruzicka at the Park Pavilion on January 8, 2011 for Mark's Barber Shop 5th Annual Big Buck Contest to be held from 6pm to 11 pm. There were no oral or written comments and the Public Hearing was closed at 7:02 PM. Schmit moved, Geppert seconded and all voted to approve this Special Event Liquor License.

Public Hearing and Second Reading – City Planner Watson stated that Ordinance 1129 helps address some existing problems where the main use of a property is on one parcel and an accessory use such as a garden shed is on an adjoining parcel. This provides and increased level of customer service with the zoning text cleanup for development lots. Mayor Krambeck opened the Public Hearing at 7:04 PM. There were no oral or written comments and the Public Hearing was closed at 7:04 PM. Baker moved, Geppert seconded and all voted to approve second reading of Ordinance 1129 - Development Lot Zoning Text Amendment.

RESOLUTION NO. 2011-01

A RESOLUTION ASSURING FAIR HOUSING.

WHEREAS, it is the City of Spearfish's firm belief that discrimination in housing not only threatens the rights and privileges of the citizens of the City of Spearfish but also menaces the institutions and foundations of free and democratic society; and

WHEREAS, this body desires to give meaning to the guarantees of equal rights contained in the Constitution and laws of this State and the United States and to encourage and bring about mutual self-respect and understanding among all citizens and groups to the City of Spearfish; and

WHEREAS, under the federal fair housing, (Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968), it is illegal to deny housing to any person because of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the City of Spearfish, South Dakota, makes a firm commitment to do all within its power to eliminate prejudice, intolerance, disorder and discrimination in housing.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the following procedures will be used to accomplish the purpose of the aforementioned resolution:

1. The City of Spearfish shall inform all city employees of the City of Spearfish's commitment to equal housing.
2. The City of Spearfish shall direct all employees to forward immediately to the Mayor any reports they receive of housing discrimination.

3. The Mayor shall forward such complaints to the South Dakota Division of Human Rights within 10 days of receipt to said complaint.

RESOLUTION NO. 2011-02

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING A CODE OF CONDUCT.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Code of Conduct is to ensure the efficient, fair and professional administration of federal grant funds in compliance with federal Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular A-102, Attachment 0, Paragraph 7, and other applicable federal and state standards, regulations, and laws.

APPLICATION

This Code of Conduct applies to all officers, employees, or agents of the City of Spearfish engaged in the award or administration of contracts supported by federal grant funds.

REQUIREMENTS

No officer, employee, or agent of the City of Spearfish shall participate in the selection, award, or administration of a contract supported by federal grant funds, if a conflict of interest, real or apparent, would be involved. Such a conflict would arise when:

- a. the employee, officer, or agent;
- b. any member of his/her immediate family;
- c. his/her partner; or
- d. an organization which employs, or is about to employ any of the above

has a financial or other interest in the firm selected for award.

The City of Spearfish officers, employees, or agents shall neither solicit nor accept gratuities, favors, or any thing of monetary value from contractors, potential contractors, or subcontractors.

REMEDIES

To the extent permitted by federal, state or local laws or regulations, violation of these standards may cause penalties, sanctions, or other disciplinary actions to be taken against the City of Spearfish officers, employees, or agents, or the contractor's, potential contractors, subcontractors, or their agents.

EFFECTIVE DATE

This resolution shall be effective upon publication.

A RESOLUTION REGARDING RESTRICTIONS ON LOBBYING.

The undersigned certifies, to the best of their knowledge and belief, that:

(1) No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any federal agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any Federal grant, the making of any Federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.

(2) If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any Federal agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, the undersigned shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.

(3) The undersigned shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award documents for all subawards at all tiers (including subgrants, and contracts under grants, subgrants, loans, and cooperative agreements) which exceed \$100,000, and that all such subrecipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.

This certification is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when this transaction was made or entered into. Submission of this certification is a prerequisite for making or entering into this transaction imposed by Section 1352, Title 31, U.S. Code. Any person who fails to file the required certification shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$100,000 for each such failure.

RESOLUTION NO. 2011-06

AN EMPLOYMENT POLICY RESOLUTION.

The City of Spearfish does hereby declare that the fundamental policy of the City of Spearfish is to provide equal opportunity to all of its employees and applicants for employment (skilled, unskilled and professional) to assure that there shall be no discrimination against any person on the basis of race, color, religion, creed, national origin, sex, age, physical or mental handicap, marital status or political beliefs unless related to a bona fide occupational requirement. To this end, City of Spearfish will take steps to equalize opportunity for employment at all levels of operation for those classes of people who have traditionally been denied equal opportunity--minority group members, women and the handicapped; and City of Spearfish recognizes an obligation to make reasonable accommodations to the known physical or mental limitations of an otherwise qualified applicant or employee unless the accommodation imposes an undue hardship.

All applicants for employment with City of Spearfish will be recruited from the available labor market evaluated on each person's individual qualifications and abilities. All employees shall be afforded equal employment opportunity during their term of employment, and are guaranteed protection against retaliation for exercising any legal or administrative procedures to secure right to equal employment or testifying on behalf of someone else doing so.

All administrators and supervisors are responsible for and shall be committed to achieving and promoting equal employment opportunity with City of Spearfish.

Jodi Friedel is the equal employment opportunity officer and shall be responsible for coordinating the equal employment opportunity program.

Adoption of this document reaffirms City of Spearfish's policy of nondiscrimination in employment, including but not limited to the following:

recruitment, selection, placement, testing, training, promotion, transfer, discipline, demotion, layoff and termination.

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First reading of Ordinance 1130 - City Planner Watson stated Ordinance 1130 is an amended school district request to rezone the 1924 building of East Elementary to R-3. While it is hoped that the building will be preserved and reworked as residential, there is not a guarantee that this change of zoning will achieve that goal. Changing the zoning only helps encourage preservation. The School District has indicated that they will detach the breezeway between the two buildings. This zoning request does not affect the 1960's building or the Administrative building. Parking issues will need to be addressed at the time of building permit. Currently, there are 45 parking stalls on Hudson which were originally thought that they could be used to satisfy the parking requirements of the new use. However, after considering that these parking areas will be a challenge with snow removal, staff has revised their recommendation that all parking for the new use needs to be located within the parcel. The existing building does meet R-3 compliance with setbacks and Planning Commission recommends approval. Young moved, Morgan seconded and all voted to approve first reading of Ordinance 1130 - To rezone East Elementary (the 1924 building) from public school to R-3 Multi Family.

Potential Fire Station Number 3 – Fire Chief White stated the department was looking for a site in the Exit 8 area for the future location of Station #3. The site at the Sports Complex has been reviewed and a station has been redesigned to fit in that location. Utilities are accessible

and the entrances are established. No additional truck or equipment purchases are anticipated as White stated we have what we need and have vehicles and equipment to fill the building. The proposed station is a four bay, east facing building of 4200 sq. ft. The department would like to see the station finished before the end of 2011 and asks for approval to use the site at the Sports Complex before proceeding with plans. Schmit moved, Morgan seconded and all voted to approve the location for future Fire Station #3 at the Sports Complex.

FYI – Raffle Request - Realtors For Kids, Inc plans to raffle a trip for two to Hawaii. Tickets to be sold from January 4, 2011 to March 31, 2011, cost of ticket is \$25.00 each. Drawing will be held on April 29, 2011 with proceeds from the raffle to benefit Realtors For Kids, Inc.

FYI – Raffle Request – Hope Ranch of Montana plans to raffle a weekend getaway to Coronato Cabin located on the 8th hole of Devil’s Tower Golf Club. Prize also includes a \$50 gift certificate to Ponderosa Café in Hulett and two golf passes to the Golf Club at Devil’s Tower. Ticket prices are one for \$20, three for \$50 or six for \$100. Tickets will be for sale from January 4, 2011 to the drawing on 1-29-2011. Drawing will be held at Homestake Opera House in Lead on 1-29-11 during the Comedy show featuring Brandt Tobler. Proceeds to go to travel expenses for the Gill family’s Ethiopian adoption – Mason Gill is 12 months old and will come home in January.

Proposal – Young moved, Morgan seconded and all voted to accept the proposal from HDR Engineering for design and topographic services for the 2013 Sanitary Sewer Improvements Project at a fee of \$23,606. \$35,000 is budgeted in 2011 Sewer for this project.

Easements – Schmit moved, Geppert seconded and all voted approval for the Mayor to sign the following easements located on the north side of Colorado Boulevard on property owned by Johnson Joy Management, LLC: **1)** 40’ water and sanitary sewer easement which will encompass an existing water main and a new 6” sewer force main; **2)** 25’ sanitary sewer easement which will encompass an existing 4” sewer force main. These easements are necessary for the 2011 Sanitary Sewer Improvements Project.

Water Line Easement – Young moved, Morgan seconded and all voted approval for the Mayor to sign water line easement located on the south side of Colorado Boulevard between Sandstone and Christensen Drive intersections on property owned by Bruce E. Miller and Lola J. Miller Trust. This easement will encompass a new 12” water main that will be constructed as part of the 2011 Colorado Boulevard Water Replacement Project.

Bid Opening – Young moved, Geppert seconded and all voted to set bid opening for the 2011 Colorado Boulevard Water Replacement Project for January 31, 2011, 1:30 p.m.
