



## 2019 Municipal & School District Election

A Municipal & School District Election will be held on Tuesday, April 9th, 2019 in Spearfish. If the polls cannot be opened due to inclement weather, the election may be postponed one week.

- Dana Boke and John Dale are running for a 3-year term for Mayor.
- Greg Krier, Kelli Ewert and Darick Eisenbraun are running for a 3-year term Ward 3 Council Member position.
- Justin Griffith, Eric Skavang and Ryan Niesent are running for a 3-year term for two School Board Member positions.

The election polls will be open from 7am to 7pm at the Senior Citizen's Center located at 1306 10th Street.

**The voter registration deadline for the April 9th election is Monday, March 25th.**

## Spring Cleanup April 25th - April 28th

Spearfish and Lawrence County residents are encouraged to participate in Spring Cleanup from April 25th - 28th. The Spearfish RUS will be waiving fees for residential disposal and City crews will offer free pick up services for city residential customers needing to dispose of large items on the 25th & 26th.

The RUS is located 1 ½ miles north of Interstate 90's Exit 10 off Highway 85 on Camp Comfort Road and will be open free of charge from 9am to 5pm during Spring Cleanup.

**Items accepted at the RUS:** Trees, leaves, grass clippings, construction materials, metal, iron, appliances, batteries, furniture, carpet and mattresses/box springs. Lawn mowers, weed eaters and any other gas/diesel powered item need to be completely drained of all fluids (fuel and oil) before being accepted at the RUS.

Tires without rims and appliances which use Freon will be accepted for a fee.

**Items not accepted:** household garbage, paper, plastic, clothing, asbestos, chemicals and hazardous or toxic wastes.

**Pick up Services:** Thursday and Friday, April 25th & 26th, City crews will offer free pick up services for Spearfish residents. Per City policy, residents are limited to **three large items**. Crews will not pick up construction materials, yard waste, cardboard, metal posts, wood or plastic items.

Disposal of large items, including appliances, will be available by calling Public Works at 642-1333, beginning **Monday, April 15th through Wednesday, April 24th at 4pm.**

**You MUST call to have items picked up. No requests will be accepted after 4pm on Wednesday, April 24th.** Free pick up does not apply to commercial accounts.

**Requirements:** Summer Customer Service Assistants and Lifeguards must be 16 years of age or older. All other positions must be 18 years of age or older before date of hire. Applicants must possess a valid driver's license with an insurable driving history. Starting wage is \$9.75-\$11.25/hr depending on position. Hours may be weather dependent.
